Initiatives are underway on large and small areas, to defragment the landscape to improve critical habitat for sage grouse. GRF is hosting a one-day field tour based near Manyberries, designed for reclamation practitioners and others with an interest in rangelands. Join regional experts sharing their insights and experience on:

- Cropland conversion to native cover projects.
- Oil and gas reclamation / restoration projects in critical sage grouse habitat.
- Regional reclamation challenges and beneficial practices

- Discussions of the challenges and solutions to restoration in this challenging environment.
